- Steve Tully, Chair of the HPC, opened the meeting with an Acknowledgement of Country.
- Council noted apologies.

1. Register and declaration of interests

 No conflicts of interest declared, but noted that Stephen Duckett has been appointed as chair of the board of Eastern Melbourne Healthcare Network Ltd (which operates and is known as Eastern Melbourne Primary Health Network).

2. Approval of the draft minutes of the meeting held on 13 September 2018

- Affirmed the minutes as a true and correct record of the meeting.
- 3. Review of responsibilities taken and updates (if any) recorded at the meeting held on 13 September 2018
- Noted progress.

4. HPC's 4-Yearly Review (2015-2018) program status

- Noted the updates.
- Resolved to write to Ian Olver AM, Chair of the Australian Health Ethics Committee of the National Health and Medical Research Council, to express HPC's concerns about the apparent untimeliness, undue risk-aversion, and non-uniformity of decision-making processes between human research ethics committees.

5. Don Frater, Deputy Chief Executive, SA Health

Don Frater being unable to attend, HPC in his absence:

- Noted on 22 November 2018, Steve Tully and Jane Austin met with Don Frater in advance of this
 meeting to discuss progress with health structural reforms.
- Noted that SA Health was progressing plans to give effect to the state government's policy for
 the creation of two new agencies Wellbeing SA, and a Commission on Excellence and
 Innovation in Health and noted the tabled in confidence and not for further distribution draft
 documents relating to the establishment of a Steering Group for the creation of that
 Commission.
- 6. Post-implementation review of Country Health SA Local Health Network's Aboriginal Community & Consumer Engagement Strategy
- Noted the Secretariat draft final report and agreed that Secretariat should finalise the report
 under the supervision of the Project Sponsors with a view to final publication around the end of
 January 2019 in accordance with the agreed communications strategy.
- Noted the project status report and other documents.

7. HPC's Scoping of an approach to monitor health outcomes for people with mental health and addiction issues

- Noted the project initiation document and debated the broad scope of work that HPC should pursue on this topic in its 2019-2022 reporting period.
- Agreed that the project as proposed should not be undertaken and instead that HPC's work on this topic be completed as two projects, subject to further HPC endorsement and discussion, to produce:
 - A mostly quantitative report covering indicators from the literature, analysis of what could be done in South Australia, how SA Health could evaluate success in this area, and a presentation of relevant data and commentary. Quantitative report to include data gap analysis, similar to the HPC's Prisoner Health report;
 - A more qualitative report with an informed consumer lens—HPC discussed including views of focus groups, patient advocates and experts-by-experience in this qualitative report.
- Agreed that addiction issues should not be considered out of scope.
- Agreed that the secretariat should procure an appropriately qualified and timely research institution to conduct for HPC a literature review and scoping study into available data.
- Accepted Jennene Greenhill's offer to sponsor work to design this project.
- Agreed that HPC should propose to SA Mental Health Commission and the two South Australian
 Primary Health Networks that they complete this project as a joint enterprise.
- 8. 'Areas to Act' report in collaboration with SA Health and Adelaide and Country SA Primary Health Networks, examining health system data for indicators of potentially preventable hospitalisations using Grattan 'Perils of Place' (2016) method
- Resolved that SA Health be, and is hereby, authorised to acknowledge HPC as a co-author of the 'Areas to Act' report and to apply the HPC logotype to the report's cover accordingly.
- Agreed to advise SA Health to repeat and revisit this work on a regular basis, at least every two
 years.
