# What this presentation will cover

- > Population and demographic data on people living in SA who were born overseas, from the Australian Bureau of Statistics (2011 Census).
- > Registered health workforce data from the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (AHPRA) (2015).

# What the OS-born population in SA looks like

- > As at 2011 Census, just under 1.6m people in SA.
- > 352k (23.2%) born OS:
  - 144k (9.5%) from English-speaking countries
  - 208k (13.7%) from non-English-speaking countries.
- > SA has welcomed people from countries all over the world:

England, Italy, India, China, Scotland, NZ, Vietnam, Germany, Greece and the Philippines.

# What the OS-born population in SA looks like

- > The age profile of the population born OS living in SA is disproportionately elderly...

**26.0%** Overseas-born popn. are aged 65+ years  
vs.

**12.8%** of Australian-born popn.

Fig. 1: Born OS

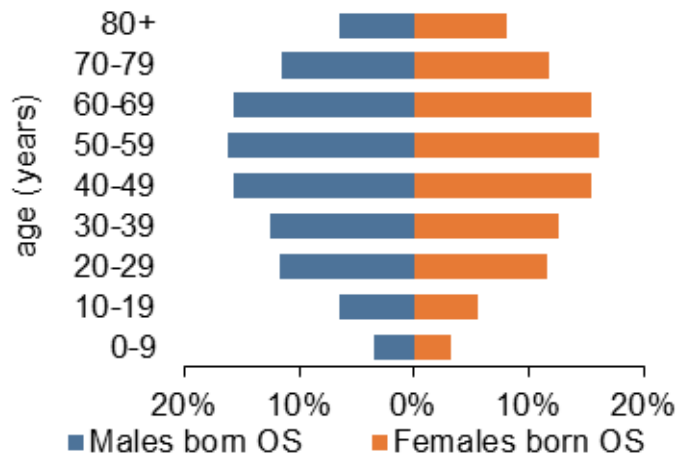
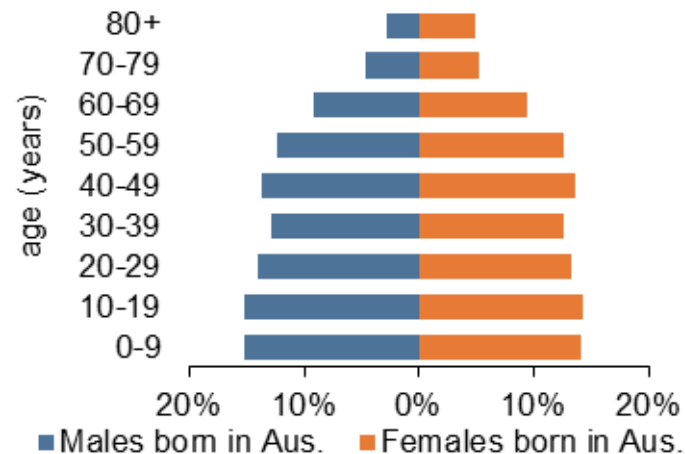


Fig. 2: Born in Australia

# What the OS-born population in SA looks like

- > Persons born OS more than twice as likely to settle in metro Adelaide vs Country SA...

Location	Popn born OS

- Northern Adelaide LHN	27.6%
- Central Adelaide LHN	30.1%
- Southern Adelaide LHN	23.7%
<b>Country SA</b>	<b>13.0%</b>
<b>SOUTH AUSTRALIA</b>	<b>23.2%</b>

# What the OS-born population in SA looks like

- > Persons born OS over-represented in lowest personal income group...

Location	Lowest quintile of personal income, Born OS	Lowest quintile of personal income, Born in Aus.

- Northern Adelaide LHN	28.5%	22.4%
- Central Adelaide LHN	26.3%	18.9%
- Southern Adelaide LHN	22.4%	20.7%
<b>Country SA</b>	<b>25.9%</b>	<b>23.6%</b>
<b>SOUTH AUSTRALIA</b>	<b>26.0%</b>	<b>21.6%</b>

# What the OS-born population in SA looks like

- > Around one in 7 people in SA speak a language other than English at home...

Location	Speaks a language other than English at home
<b>Metro Adelaide</b>	<b>19.2%</b>
- Northern Adelaide LHN	18.4%
- Central Adelaide LHN	27.0%
- Southern Adelaide LHN	10.3%
<b>Country SA</b>	<b>4.8%</b>
<b>SOUTH AUSTRALIA</b>	<b>15.0%</b>

# What the OS-born population in SA looks like

- > One in 40 people in SA either don't speak English very well or not at all...

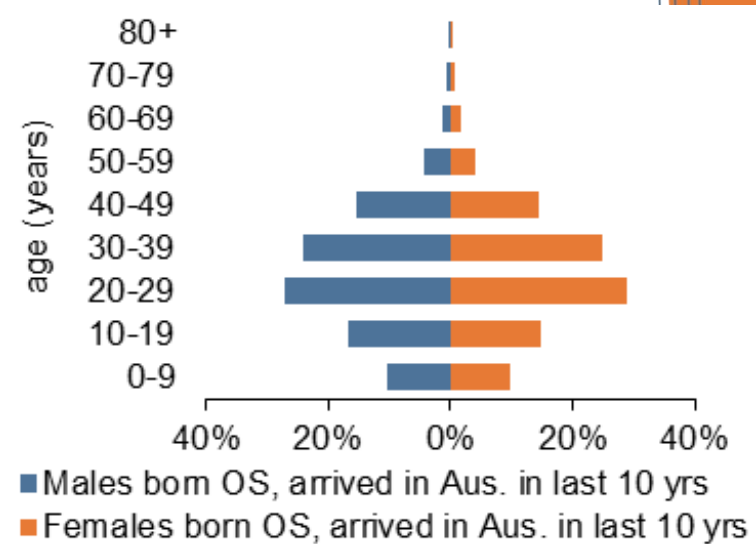

- Central Adelaide LHN	4.7%
- Southern Adelaide LHN	1.4%

# What the OS-born population in SA looks like

- > Around a third of South Australians born OS have lived in Australia for 10 years or less...
- > ... and are much younger than overall population...

Location	Born OS & arrived in Aus. in last 10 yrs.
<b>Metro Adelaide</b>	<b>33.8%</b>
- Northern Adelaide LHN	29.8%
- Central Adelaide LHN	38.2%
- Southern Adelaide LHN	31.6%
<b>Country SA</b>	<b>19.8%</b>
<b>SOUTH AUSTRALIA</b>	<b>31.5%</b>

# CALD health workforce in SA

- > The Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (AHPRA) responsible for implementation of National Registration and Accreditation Scheme across Australia.
- > AHPRA works with 14 National Health Practitioner Boards in implementing the scheme.
- > Scoping study was to include cultural diversity of the professionally registered SA health workforce but data was not available within timeframe of report.
- > Data received in May 2016 and presented here for first time.

# CALD health workforce in SA

## Notes on the data provided by AHPRA...

- > Includes public and private health sectors.
- > Country of birth data as at 31 Oct 2015.
- > Language data as at 31 July 2015.
- > Country of birth grouped into regions using Australian Bureau of Statistics' standard.
- > Data was provided by AHPRA de-identified.
- > HPC Secretariat had to make some assumptions with small cells in data tables to produce estimates.

- > Almost two-thirds of registered public and private health workforce consists of nurses and midwives.

# CALD health workforce in SA

- > Languages information provided voluntarily by practitioners where they want it recorded for the public's information.
- > These percentages are therefore not representative, but as reported...
  1. Chinese languages (20.5%)
  2. Indo-Aryan (17.0%)
  3. Southeast Asian Austronesian languages (11.8%)
  4. Dravidian\* (7.1%)
  5. African languages (4.3%).



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
